 - a. **Community Farm Report:** Nancy Fasano—Garden opening June 1st, see attached inventory of plantings poundage disbursed.
 - b. **Greenhouse Progress:** Tom gave us a tour of the nearly completed Greenhouse; will be ready for seed plantings scheduled for mid-February. Kudos for Tom and Jim for fabricating an excellent addition to the Community Garden. Doug and Dave from the City's DPW also assisted with this project. It was noted that the budget for this structure was \$700, and the actual costs were \$600.
 - c. **Garden of Tears and Hope:** Work began on this project and was halted because of concerns of the Sunset Lake Commission. Tom will research relevant ordinances to determine responsibilities of the Lake Commission.
 - d. **Community Forestry Management Plan:** Tom received word from DEP's Community Forestry Office that a new plan will be due 2022.

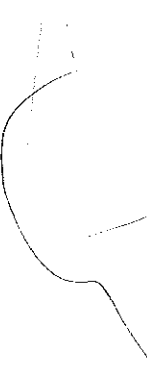



The Asbury Park Community Garden is managed by volunteers from the Asbury Park Environmental Shade Tree Commission. There are 24 raised beds located between City Hall & the Train Station where organic vegetables and herbs are cultivated, harvested, and then distributed free to community members each Saturday at the Farm Stand beginning in June through the end of September. Beginning in July, the weekly harvest was distributed in recycleable cloth bags that were sewn by members of ESTC from donated fabric. We have given out over 100 cloth bags this Summer, and always encourage customers to return with their bags. On average, 22 families a week visit the Farm Stand. They represent a cross section of AP residents. We see over 60% repeat customers, and many new faces.
