Dear Resident,

On April 12, 2017, the Asbury Park City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2017-14, which designated paid parking on the south side of Sunset Avenue and north side of Fifth Avenue between Grand Avenue and Webb Street. Correspondingly, the resident-only permit parking regulations on the north side and south side of Sunset and Fifth Avenues, respectively, would be extended to Grand Avenue (the 400 Block). Residents with Zone 5 parking permits will also be permitted to park in the metered spaces on the opposite sides of the street.

On Tuesday, August 8th, 2017 (weather permitting), parallel parking spaces will be striped on Sunset and Fifth Avenues between Grand Avenue and Webb Street. There will be emergency no parking signs posted on Sunset and Fifth Avenues, as no vehicles will be permitted to park on those streets between Grand Avenue and Webb Street on August 8th.

New parking pay stations from the IPS Group are scheduled to be installed during the week of August 21st. Parking payments can also be made at existing pay stations or using the Asbury PARK mobile app (www.asburyparkapp.com). In order to ease the transition of this new regulation, the Parking Utility will not be issuing tickets for overtime parking until such time that the new pay stations are installed.

Residents with Zone 5 permits will be able to continue to park on the north side of Sunset Avenue and the south side of Fifth Avenue. The permit-only parking regulation will extend further down those sides of the street to Grand Avenue. Residents of the 400 Block of Sunset and Fifth Avenues will now be permitted to purchase a Zone 5 residential permit. Additionally, all Zone 5 permit holders will be permitted to park in the new metered spaces on the opposite side of the street. The Parking Committee will continue to evaluate the pilot resident-only Zone 5 parking program, with changes possible for 2018.

The annual cost of the Zone 5 residential permit is \$90 for the first permit and \$120 for the second permit. If extenuating circumstances exist and are approved, a third and fourth permit can be issued at an annual cost of \$150 and \$180, respectively. To obtain a permit, residents are required to present a driver's license and registration, as well as a current deed/lease and utility bill as proof of residence.
